NATURE AND SCOPE OF PRACTICE:

Responsibilities in the Surgical Oncology practice include: obtaining comprehensive health history, performing physical examinations, making health assessments, and prescribing pharmocologic and non-pharmocologic treatments. The primary focus is on evaluation, management, teaching, and follow-up of patients with benign or malignant breast conditions.

In the Breast and Ovarian Cancer Genetics and Risk Assessment Program, responsibilities include: 1) obtaining health history with emphasis on cancer as well as multi-generational pedigree construction with focus on family history of cancer.

2) cancer risk counseling including, risk assessment, counseling and education, and recommendations for risk reduction, screening and treatment. 3) comprehensive pre and post test counseling and ordering of genetic testing for cancer predisposition.
