# **Breast Health Program**

### R.N. Specialist, Breast Health

Qualifications: BSN and Breast Health Specialist certificate. Experience in Women's Health.

**Position Summary** – To maintain and coordinate the Breast Health Program. Serve as a patient advocate by providing support and acting as a liaison between patients and specialists. Work with multidisciplinary services to coordinate patient education, diagnostics, treatment and follow-up of breast cancer patients.

#### **Patient Advocate**

- Contact all patients who have an abnormal mammogram.
- Provide information, comfort and support.
- Answer any questions the patient or family may have.
- Explain in detail upcoming procedures, based on previously determined protocols defined by Breast health Task Force.
- Assess patient upon arrival for procedures (vitals).
- Stay with patient throughout procedure.
- Assess patient prior to discharge and provide instructions.
- Expedite results to referring physicians.
- Follow-up with patient after results are available.
- Able to discuss basics of breast pathology.

### **Diagnostics**

- Coordinate booking of stereotactic and ultrasound biopsies and follow-up as needed.
- Provide educational material about the procedures.

#### **Treatment**

- Act as a liaison between patients and referring physicians, surgeons, oncologists, etc.
- Assist with a second opinion if necessary.
- Coordinate participation in the Multidisciplinary Breast Clinic at the Cancer Center.
- Coordinate scheduling appointments once treatment has been determined.

#### **Breast Health Education**

- Coordinate the availability of patient education materials at all sites, as well as be familiar with resources available in the community (i.e., support groups, prostheses centers, VNA, etc.).
- Teach breast self-exam and promote annual screening.

- Provide counseling for high-risk patients, newly diagnosed patients and outpatients with questions regarding their diagnosis.
- Provide guidance for genetic testing if desired.
- Encourage yearly screening.

#### **Education for Patients Prior to Surgery**

- Develop a patient Breast Cancer Class that would be offered to all women at the time of diagnosis.
- Develop a binder to be given to each patient with information including:
  - Breast cancer treatment options
  - Facts about surgical procedures
  - What can be expected after surgery
  - Exercise options (P.T., O.T.)
  - Lymphadema treatment and support
  - Sexuality changes
  - Drug therapy (Tamoxifen, HRT)
  - Coping
  - Support groups Social Work Services (coordinated with the Cancer Center)
  - Information about wigs and prostheses
  - Information about "Reach to Recovery" and "Look Good, Feel Better"
  - Educational information about Radiation and Chemotherapy if needed.
